## Carlos Santana wants to save the world with music via “Corazón” and with “Corazón”

NEW YORK, May 22, 2014 (AP)— Try to speak with Carlos Santana about his new album and he'll want to talk about another topic: *changing the world*.

The veteran musician says he is planning a concert aimed at encouraging and motivating the development of young black and Latino men in the wake of Trayvon Martin's death and Donald Sterling's racist comments. He wants to hold the event next year in Florida and is working with Harry Belafonte.

"I'm not show biz and entertainment, I'm an activist," he said. "I'm a person who with passion believes that we can change the world, we can transform hate and fear forever with the right songs and the right timing."

Santana's latest album, "Corazón," debuted at No. 9 on the Billboard 200 albums chart last week. It features Juanes, Gloria Estefan, and Miguel, and Santana said it wasn't hard finding "Cinderella or Cinderella" to guest on the songs, which he calls "glass slippers."

"We said, 'Hey man, this is going to be great at the Latin Grammys. We got to make an impact there,'" he recalled. "And I go, 'Latin Grammys, why stop there? Why don't we go to the World Cup?' Well guess what, we're closing the World Cup with brother Wyclef (Jean)!"

In an interview with The Associated

Press, Santana, 66, had advice for Jay Z, and talked about his tour with Rod Stewart, which kicks off Friday in Albany, New York.

AP: How does it feel to release another album?

Santana: I feel really, really honored to gain people's trust. People opened their hearts and their wallets. ... It allows me to do more things with my brother Harry Belafonte and (activist) Dolores Huerta. ... And so we want to have a concert and bring Jamie Foxx and different kinds of artists, musicians of all colors and utilize this attention and this energy. ... Obviously (with) what happened with Donald Sterling and what's happening with people throwing bananas at soccer stadiums, you know, we have a lot to heal.

AP: Who else do you want to invite to



AP: How did your tour with Rod Stewart come about?

Santana: I can say it the way Wayne Shorter and Herbie Hancock would say it, 'Both of us love to play spiritual music to touch all hearts.' That's one thing. The rascal in me ... says, 'We both love black music. We like to play black music for white people.'

AP: There are a number of collaborative tours this summer, from Kiss and Def Leppard to Beyonce and Jay Z. Who

the concert? would you like to see hit the road together?

Santana: I'd like to see Metallica and Wayne Shorter and Herbie Hancock to broaden the wings. Metallica did a thing with a symphony, so they're capable, of course, of playing without volume or with volume. I just like to expand popularity with genius. ... I invite brothers like Jay Z who have the money to start bringing the African brothers back to the United States. Since 9/11, if your name is Idrissa Diop or if you have a Muslim name, they won't let you in. But they let the Irish people in and they let the Canadian people in and people from Australia. Man, how come you don't let the African people come in? ... If I had the money and the means that Jay Z has, I would bring African musicians. ... I'm going to invite them. We're going to create something like this in Las Vegas where we can co-headline, because these brothers need to be taken to schools in America so the brothers (here) can learn how to play the drums again. That's the thing I have in common with Africa \_ I understand the drum ... it's in my DNA.

## Eva Longoria: EE.UU. tendrá un presidente latino

CANNES, Francia, 21 de mayo de 2014 (AP): Estados Unidos vio la llegada de su primer presidente negro y Eva Longoria no duda en que el primer presidente latino no tardará en llegar.

"Con los cambios demográficos en Estados Unidos, definitiva e inevitablemente habrá un presidente latino", dijo la actriz.

Longoria, quien se encontraba en la Riviera francesa para participar por novena ocasión en el Festival de Cine de Cannes como embajadora de L'Oréal,

habló sobre su esperanza de promover a futuros líderes latinos a través de su reciente Proyecto para la Victoria Latina.

La actriz dice que la iniciativa busca que la gente "promueva una agenda prolatinos, proinmigración, prorreforma de educación, proasistencia sanitaria" y a candidatos que están "peleando la batalla en este momento en nuestra política".

En cuanto al candente tema de una reforma de inmigración, la demócrata espera ver pronto una acción positiva en su país: "Ha sido bloqueada por algunas pocas per-

sonas en el gobierno y espero que podamos continuar impulsando su aceptación antes de la próxima elección". Las elecciones al Congreso son en el otoño.

Desde el final de "Desperate Housewives", Longoria se ha mantenido del otro lado de las cámaras como productora ejecutiva de la teleserie de comedia "Devious Maids" y del documental "Food Chains", que resalta las



penurias de los jornaleros explotados.

La actriz dice que para ella es importante "representar lo correcto en la televisión y en el cine".

"Yo he sido realmente afortunada de tener opciones y no quiero trabajar a menos que sea en algo importante, algo que quiera hacer, o algo divertido y emocionante", dijo.

### Lansing's Cristo Rey Fiesta "refreshed" for 2014

A Lansing Memorial Day weekend tradition, *Cristo Rey Catholic Church* presented its annual *Fiesta*, May 23 to May 25, 2014.

The annual *Cristo Rey Fiesta* hosted thousands of community members celebrating Latino/Hispanic culture, food, music, and families under massive event tents in the church's parking lot in south Lansing. This family-friendly event is a major fundraiser for the church, bringing

in thousands of dollars for its religious and humanitarian programs.

Entertainment selections were broadened to reflect more varied tastes in several Latin genres, adding *bachata* and old-school "country" to the mix. A live DJ-hosted remote, hailing from "*La Poderosa*" (1080fm/640am), occurred Saturday, and is part of a larger promotional agreement between the growing station and the *Fiesta*, including adver-

tising on the channel in the weeks leading up to the *Fiesta*.

Additional promotion has come in the role of a new publicity committee member, which has resulted in a print ad campaign in the Saginaw, Ann Arbor, Detroit, Adrian, Grand Rapids, and Toledo markets, along with increased social media presence—*La Prensa* included. *La Prensa* is distributed in southern Michigan and northern and central Ohio.

The raffle, which is always a highlight on the last day of the event, had a high-value prize of \$3,000, but limited the number of tickets sold to only 2,000, increasing odds of winning.

**WMU becomes part of Osher Lifelong Learning Institute network**

KALAMAZOO: The Bernard Osher Foundation has selected Western Michigan University to become the newest member of the national network of lifelong learning programs it supports.

WMU's Academy of Lifelong Learning, which has been offering classes for older adults in southwest Michigan since 2011, is now the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Western Michigan University. The agreement, effective April 1th, comes with an operating grant of \$100,000 from the foundation to WMU. Once the institute demonstrates success and potential for sustainability, the Osher Foundation will consider awarding an endowment of \$1 million to provide permanent support for WMU's lifelong learning initiative, which is administered by Extended University Programs.

"We're enormously pleased about this relationship with Osher, which is the nation's premier name in lifelong learning," says Dr. John M.



Dunn, president of WMU. "The addition of resources and the opportunity to be part of the Osher network will result in even broader success for our program that is already enthusiastically received by the citizens of the communities we serve."

WMU's program will join Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes at 117 other colleges and universities in locations that range from Maine to Hawaii and Alaska. The San Francisco-based Osher Foundation began its financial support for such programs in 2001.

**Report: Racial inequity plagues child welfare**

LANSING, May 21, 2014 (AP): The Michigan Race Equality Coalition says minority children are more likely than white children to enter and stay in the state's foster care system.

A new report supports anecdotal evidence and national studies that show racial disparities in child welfare. Coalition leaders say the data could help state agencies improve prevention and early intervention efforts, and will inform policies to support children in the system.

The report says African-American children are more than twice as likely to age out of the foster care system. Hispanic children are 40 percent more likely to be removed from their homes.

The coalition is led by Supreme Court Justice Mary Beth Kelly and ex-state Rep. Lynn Jondahl. It includes more than 40 advocacy organizations, circuit courts and law enforcement groups.

## Henry Ford College Financial Aid Priority Deadline is Thursday, June 5

Dearborn: Henry Ford College (HFC) students need to submit their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) materials by Thursday, June 5, 2014, in order to receive financial aid for the fall 2014



financial aid award.

It takes approximately three to five days from the time a student submits his or her FAFSA to the HFC Financial Aid Office until it is entered into the College's computer system. Students

need to plan ahead. The HFC Financial Aid Office must receive student FAFSA materials for the 2014-15 academic year and all other required documentation by the Financial Aid Priority Deadline in order to protect students from the de-registration process.

The website to submit a FAFSA is [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). The HFC school code is 002270.

Students who do NOT meet the Financial Aid Priority Deadline are still able to apply for financial aid. However, they will be responsible for setting up an EZ Pay Installment Plan or paying for their classes in full by the payment deadline, while they wait for the processing of their

Students who meet both these deadlines will have their financial aid files reviewed before the start of the fall 2014 semester and their classes will be protected while they wait for their financial aid award.

Students who do NOT meet the Financial Aid Priority Deadline are still able to apply for financial aid. However, they will be responsible for setting up an EZ Pay Installment Plan or paying for their classes in full by the payment deadline, while they wait for the processing of their
